Progression of Interventions

POLICE

DISTRICT INTERVENTIONS

Starlight, Drug and Behavior Interventions, Recovery Services, Truancy Program, Expulsions. Community School

SCHOOL INTERVENTIONS

Detention (After School, Lunch, Other), Site Based Saturday School, Other School Consequences (Informative, Reflective, Restorative), Student Assistance Teams, Loss of Extra- Curricular Activities, Suspensions

CLASSROOM INTERVENTIONS

Warning, Behavior/Action Plan, Student/Parent Conferences, Written Referrals, Referrals to School Based Therapists/Counselling, Referral to Guidance Counselor

Purpose of School-Based Interventions

- •Help the student change a negative behavior (one that is getting in the way of success) into one that supports growth, development and success.
- •We do this through our skillful application of strategies rooted in behavioral science.

Growth Based Interventions

- Instructional
- Reflective
- Restorative

Instructional

Provides opportunity for students that targets the function of the behavior and helps them **learn** the skill needed to not engage in such behaviors again

- Behavior Lessons
- Social Skills
- Teaching Opportunities

Reflective

Provides opportunities for students to **reflect** about the decisions they make that led to discipline

- Reflection Sheets
- Role Playing
- Interviews

Restorative

Provides opportunities for the student to **restore** relationship between themselves and stakeholder(s) they have affected due to the behavior incident.

- Apology
- Student Contracts
- Community Service
- Restitution




EVACUATION MAP

Expulsions 48915(c) – 'Big 5'

Must expel violations:

- 1. Possessing, selling, or otherwise furnishing a firearm
- 2. Brandishing a knife at another person
- 3. Unlawfully selling a controlled substance
- 4. Committing or attempting to commit a sexual assault
- 5. Possession of an explosive

On Call School Resource Officers (SRO)/Neighborhood Resource Officers (NRO)

- Long term contract with local police departments
- Officers are on-call and serve multiple schools within their jurisdiction


